Friends Launch Sardis and Stamm Fundraising Campaign

Sardis and Stamm are the names of the two units comprising Antioch Dunes and the names of the two main characters.in the Friends' next children's book. The story is about the endangered Lange's metalmark butterfly and Sardis, a little girl who rides her bike to an adventure in the sand dunes at the edge of the San Joaquin River to help Stamm, the butterfly with stammering flight.

The campaign goal is to raise \$2,500 toward publishing expenses and have the book finished by the start of the 2013 school year. The Friends will provide a free copy of the book to each school class that comes to Antioch Dunes NWR to help with restoration efforts. The book will be sold at Refuge headquarters to defray the cost of a second printing.

Come Take a Nature Walk Tubbs Island Trail San Pablo Bay National Wildlife Refuge

Part of the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service's San Pablo Bay National Wildlife Refuge, the Tubbs Island Trail offers excellent bird watching and great views of the San Pablo and Greater San Francisco Bays and surrounding ridgelines and peaks. The trail starts near the intersection of Hwy 121 and Hwy 37 near Sears Point on the south side of 37, follows Tolay Creek, and splits for a loop around Lower Tubbs Island. The total trail length to complete the loop and back is approximately 8.15 flat miles with minimal elevation gain/loss. Birdwatching is often best at low tides. Check tides at: http://www.tide-forecast.com/locations/Petaluma-River-entrance-San-Pablo-Bay-California/tides/latest

Trails may be seasonally closed due to flooding/tides – check the condition of the levees by calling the San Pablo Bay National Wildlife Headquarters at 707-769-4200. Be sure to stop by the Refuge Headquarters at 7715 Lakeville Highway, Petaluma.
